Jamshedpur, Jan. 9: P.P. Mitra, principal labour and employment advisor, ministry of labour and employment, government of India, said the main focus of the ministry is labour reforms and see that all rights of the labour must be respected.

The Union government will issue a unique identification number for unorganised workers to ensure them best benefits of government welfare and industrial policies.

Mitra while addressing to the gathering at the 7th national industrial relations conference organized by XLRI in the town on Saturday said that the government will issue this 'Unorganised workers identification number (UWIN)' soon to the workers and procedure in this regard is

"The software for this card has been created and concerning authorities will get it soon for proper implementation. Around 43 crore workforce in the country are engaged in unorgansied sector and they will be benefited with the number.

The UWIN will be a land mark for implementation of government policies for unorganized workers", Mitra said. The theme of the conference "Changing Labour Market and Industrial Relations, Changing Times: Make in India and the Ensuring Labour Reforms".

The ministry has taken e-governance initiative and has developed unified wed portal 'Shram Suvidha', catering to four major organisations under its aegis.

Office of Chief Labour Commissioner (Central); Directorate General of Mines Safety; Employees' Provident Fund Organization; and Employees' State Insurance Corporation. The portal has several features including- Unique Labour Identification Number (LIN) allotted to Units facilitating online registration, filing of self-certified, simplified Single Online Return by industry. Units will only file a single consolidated Online Return, instead of separate Returns.


