Stress laid on improving tea industry, role of small tea growers lauded

JORHAT, March 26: "What we saw was terrific inside the experimental labs of Tocklai Tea Research Institute. Farmers need to take the advantage of the work that has been done at TRA," said Rita Teotia, Commerce Secretary, Government of India, at a seminar organized by Tea Board of India at Tocklai Tea Research Institute on Saturday evening.

Téotia, who attended as the chief guest, while addressing the scientists, said, "The work you do is not scientific research in isolation, your work translates the real economy impact on the ground for the farmers who are in the tea sector." She added, "Knowledge transfer to farmers is an uphill task which has become a reality. But there is a perception in India that the output that comes from the small growers is inferior in quality and therefore may not commemorate the prices. This is something we understood and this is something we need to challenge. I put it to the technical community and the Tea Board that predominantly in Sri Lanka and Kenya the growers are small and that tea which has a global market, except for our Darjeeling tea, gets a premium price. So if those farmers are able to do it, there is no reason that the small farmers here do not get good price."

Teotia said that schemes and progress needed to be geared up to look at the quality of the

Teotia said that schemes and progress needed to be geared up to look at the quality of the tea industry and she further appreciated the role of the small growers who had been playing a pivotal role in contributing at least 25 per cent of bought tea leaves. "A large number of good quality clones are coming out from TRA which have been scattered throughout the north-eastern region," she said. She added that the work done by the Tea Board so far was not enough. "It does not understand the requirement of the industry. But we need to see to it that what we are doing

But we need to see to it that what we are doing sharply focuses as part of our plan. We can use the Tea Board in order to do integrated area based planning. It is only the way to integrate and start looking farmer by farmer." "We have written to the State governments that all schemes of the Government of India should be made available to the tea workers and the Government of Assam has made many efforts in this direction, whether it is education, health, sanitation or housing. Pradhan Mantri Krishi Sanshayan Yojana has been made available and other schemes generated for small farmers will also be available to the tea gardens," said Teotia.


